


Sex of children for parents that provided information









they live from school












Parents' opinions about how much their child's school encourages or discourages walking and biking to/from school

1587855	As a parent, I believe that walking to school and back is a great idea, however, there are some reasons why I do not allow them to walk including safety reasons with traffic and no crossing guards; the weather and the time.
