Additionally, <br> a crosswalk should be painted onto the asphalt of the Pine Hill School front parking lot on the SE side <br> across where cars drive into and out of the side/rear parking lot because visibility is low and because the <br> sidewalk ends abruptly on both sides of the driving corridor. I anticipate needing to walk this route for <br> the next 9 years, while my children attend Pine Hill School and South Bay School via Pine Hill School bus <br> stop, so am hoping this survey results in increased safety. |
