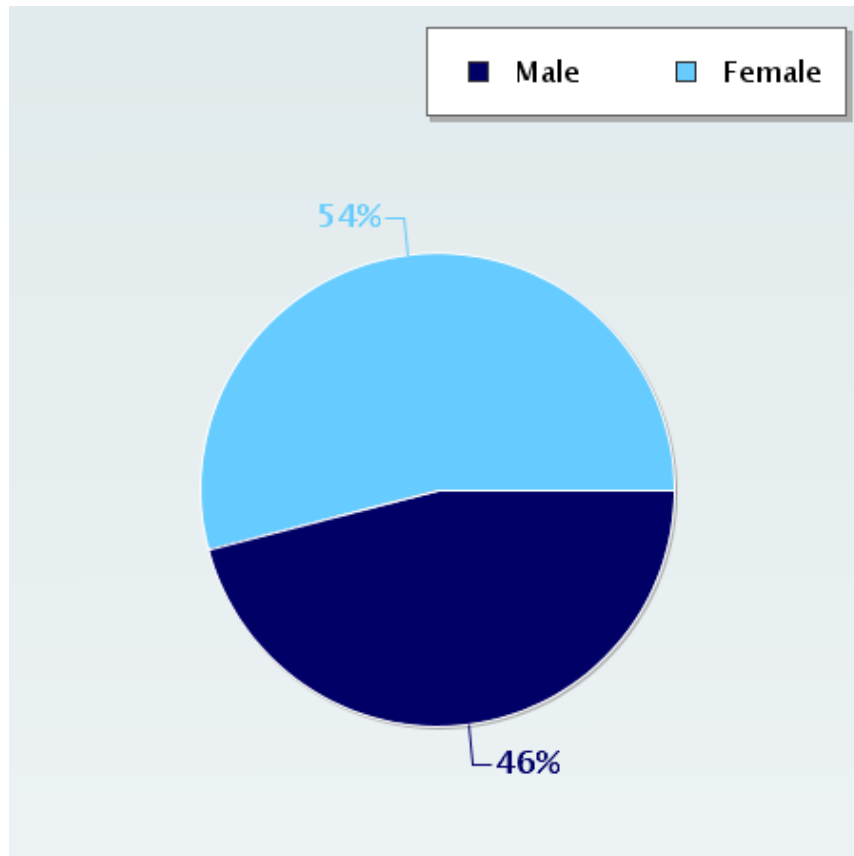

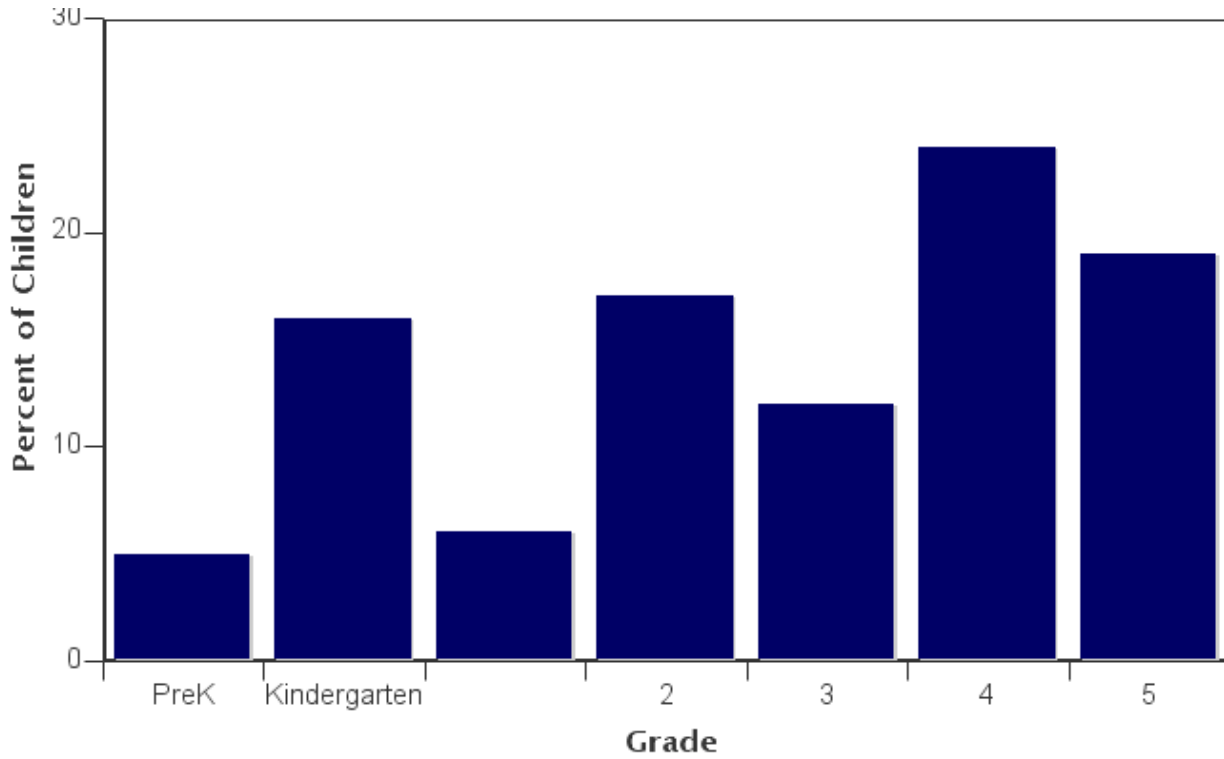

Grade levels of children represented in survey



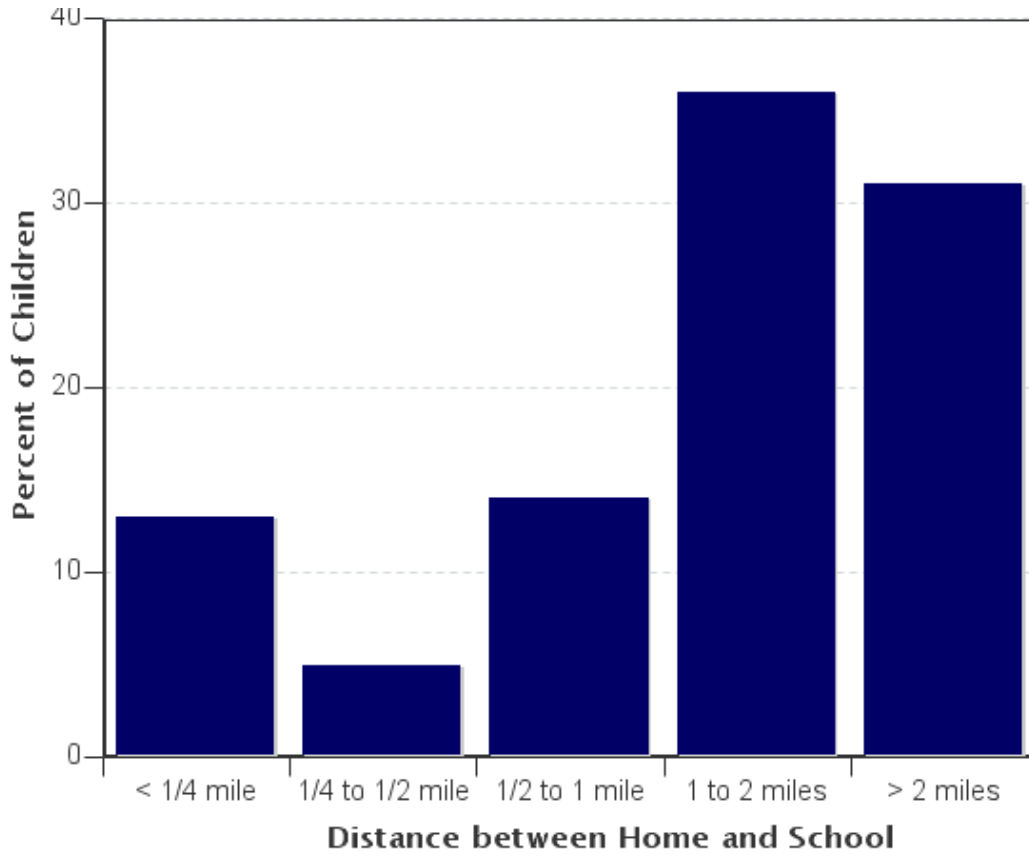

Parent estimate of distance from child's home to school



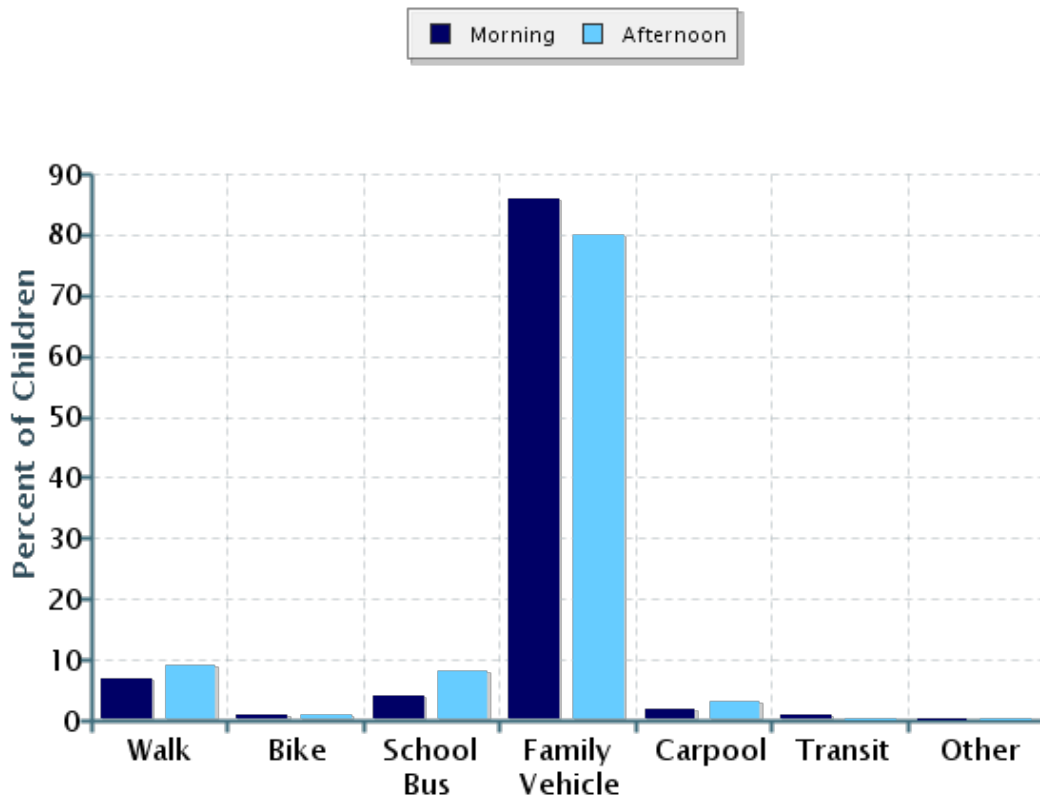

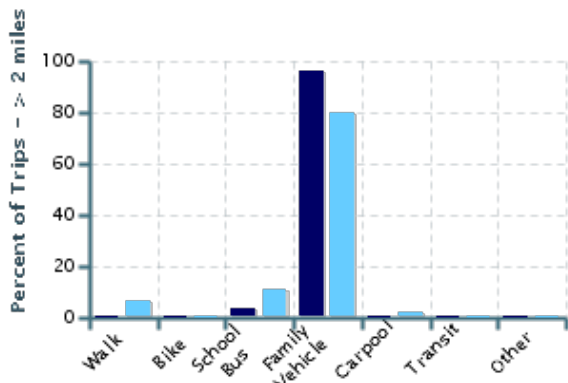

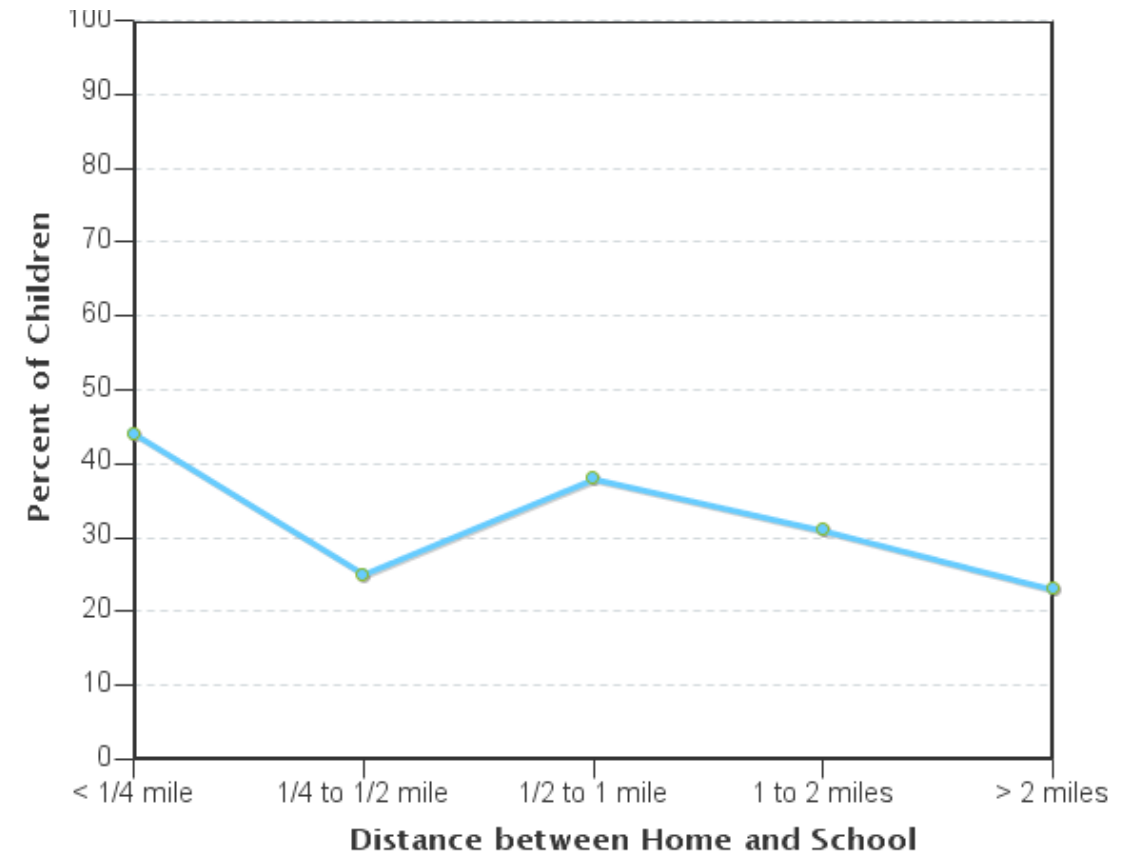

Percent of children who have asked for permission to walk or bike to/from school by distance they live from school

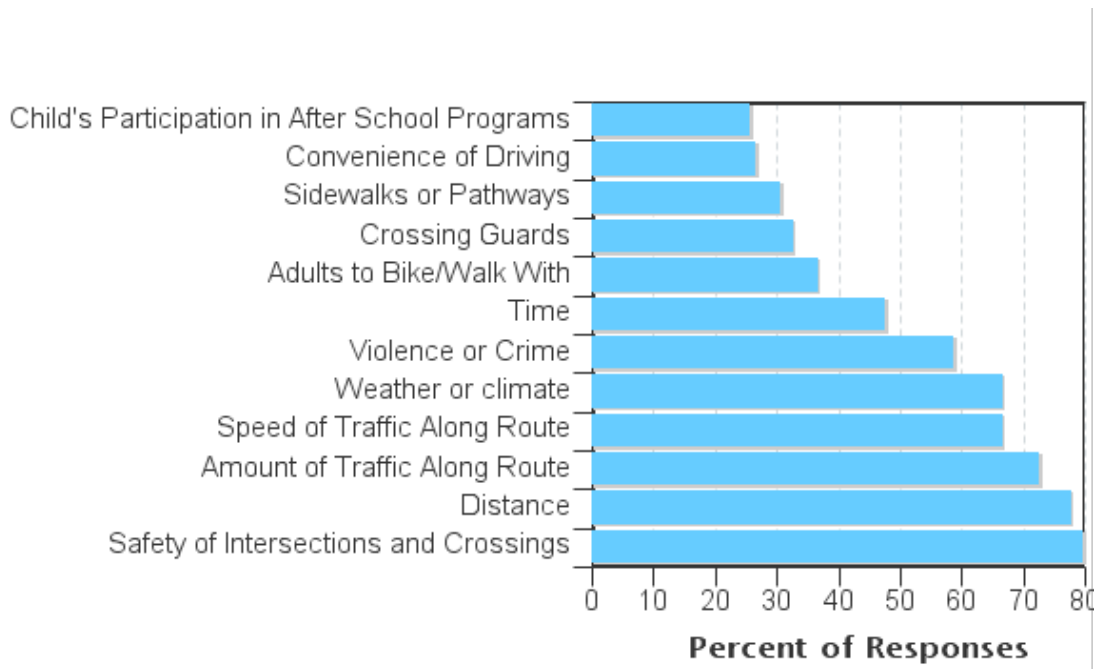

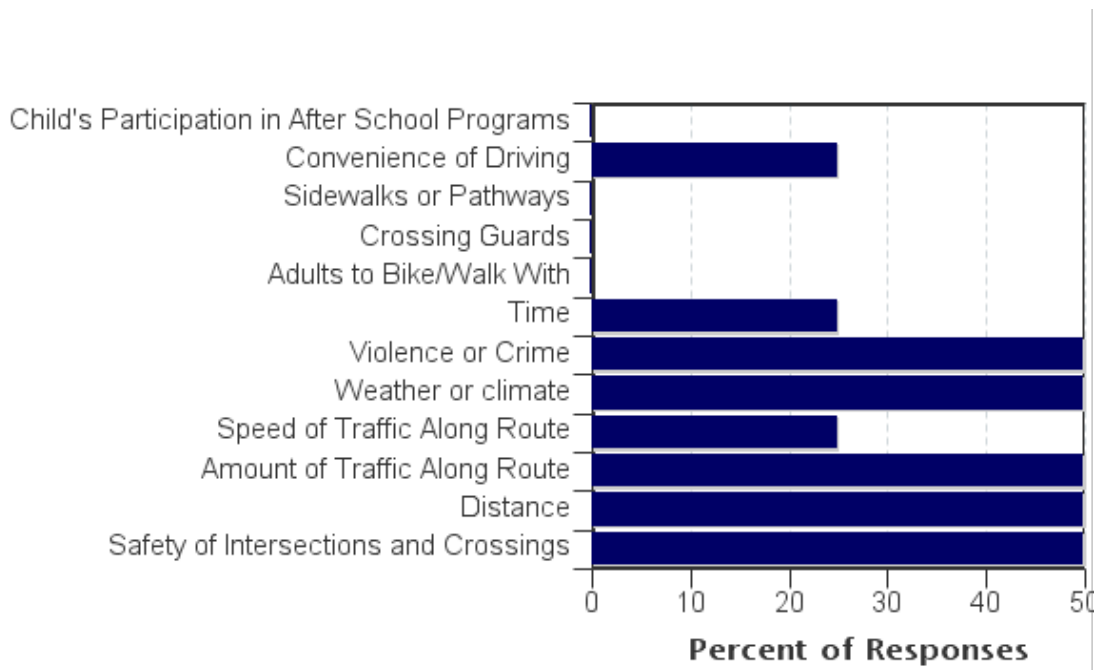

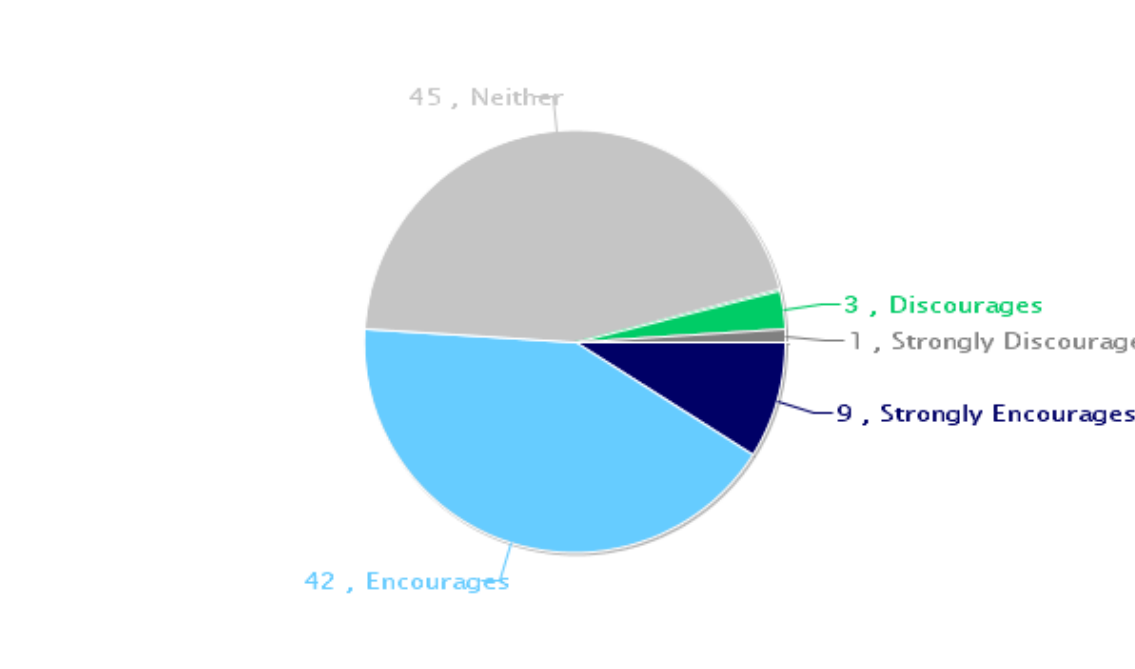

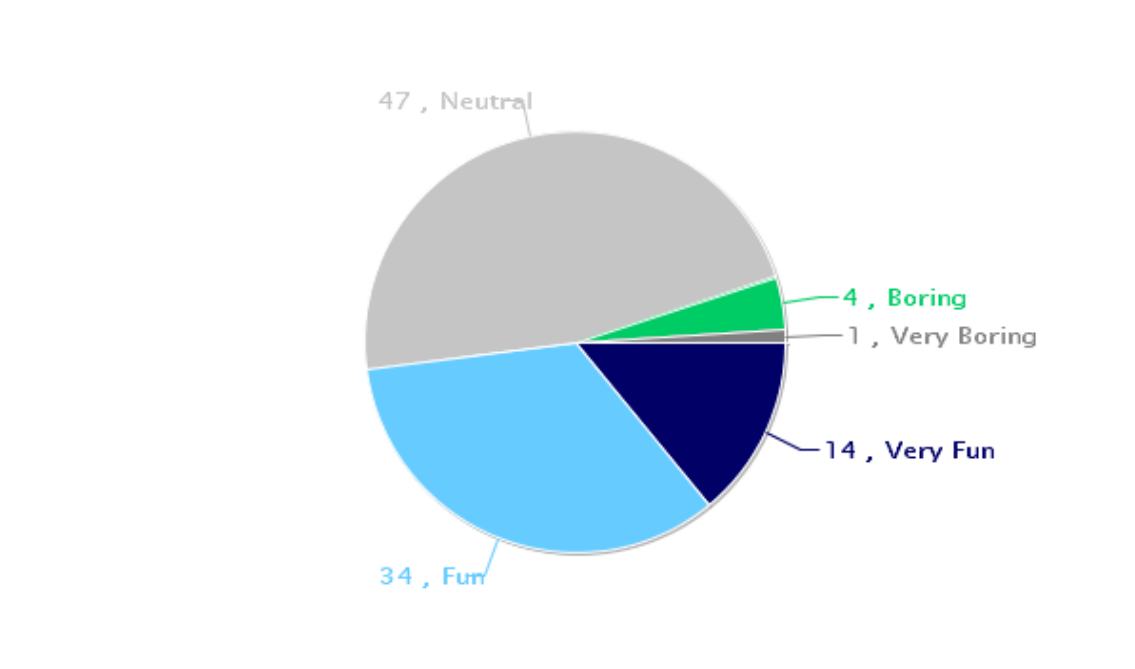

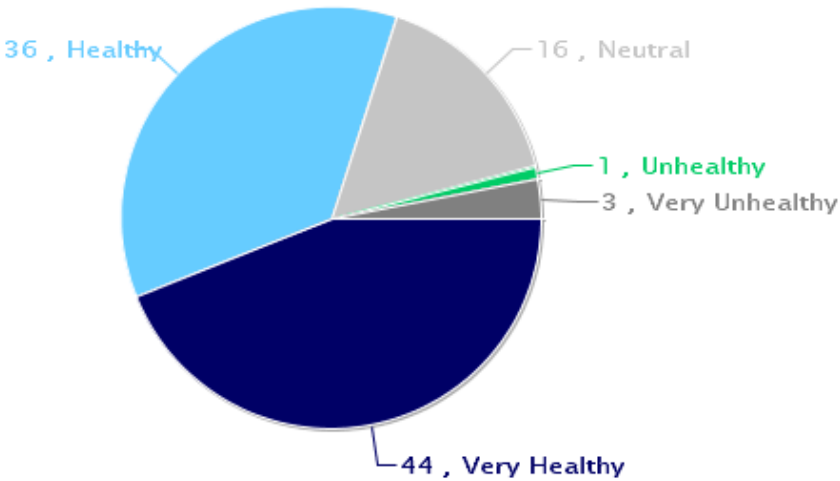
Parents' opinions about how much their child's school encourages or discourages walking and biking to/from school

1586323	I think the only thing that would change the decision to let my child walk/bike to school would be if I was available and had enough time to go with her.
1586330	My child is too young to consider. We live too far and there are way too many busy streets!
1586372	This town is not safe anymore and there are homeless on the way to school. Traffic terrible and so is the weather.
1586387	I don't feel comfortable with my children walking or riding alone. I would allow them to walk or bike if we lived closer and we had time to walk/bike our children to school.
1586582	Washington doesn't encourage children to walk. It is extremely challenging transporting my children because of the different release times - K & 5th. My child used to walk home from Cutten Elementary, but living on Harris the traffic is extremely fast and dangerous.
1586607	My kids train or play a sport 7 days a week. The amount of traffic - I would NEVER let them walk. Especially since the traffic around Washington is so crazy! People drive too fast!
1586333	I plan to walk with my son when weather/time permits. I am waiting for him to get set in his routine before adding so much activity. I think him being tired might aggravate the behavior problems we are working through.
1586351	I am very concerned about abduction and human trafficking in our community.
1586340	Not a safe community for children to walk or ride bikes to school.
1586352	The only (adult) to walk/ride bike to and from school with my kids is me, Dad. With black belt judo, karate, maybe she'll walk to school.
1586379	At 5 or 7 years old, I'm just not ready to let them walk independently to school. Not sure when.
1586554	Child is small for her age.
1586517	Eureka systemically has a pedestrian safety issue. In general, residential speed limits are too fast (ex, "S", "H", "I" Streets)
1586318	My child would love to walk/bike to school but it would be about 5 miles/day and she's 5 years old. We would love to live closer.
1586320	My child is too young to walk to school in this dangerous town and never will!!
